Kamaladevi : First woman to run for a legislative seat in India

India's independence was a watershed moment in the country's history. The British dominated India for a long time, and it took a long time to free India from the British Raj. So many independence fighters gave their life for the sake of India's happiness. Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhas Chandra Bose, Rani Laxmi Bai, and others are well known independence warriors. However, there were many additional freedom fighters who gave their life for the people of India, in addition to these well-known figures. The names of these warriors have faded into obscurity over time. Birsa Munda, Kamla Devi, Tirupur Kumaran, Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay, and others are some of the unsung heroes of the liberation struggle.

Most Indians know Kamaladevi as a figure who revived Indian handicrafts and nurtured the majority of the country's national institutions promoting dance, drama, art, theatre, music, and puppetry. Kamaladevi was also a key figure in the international socialist feminist movement. Kamaladevi served as an emissary for Indian women and political freedom from the late 1920s to the 1940s and beyond. She also promoted transnational issues such as racism and international political and economic fairness. In Berlin in 1929, she also attended the International Alliance of Women. Kamaladevi, who was born into a Saraswat Brahmin family in Mangalore, was highly influenced by Gandhian principles and the philosophy of nonviolence. Her upbringing can be blamed for a lot of it. Her parents were progressive thinkers who were active in the civil rights movement of the time. After Kamaladevi's father died while she was young, her mother was primarily responsible for her academic upbringing. Her grandma was notorious for defying the restrictions imposed on widows and continuing her quest for knowledge and independence. By 1923, Kamaladevi had joined the nationalist cause as a member of the Congress party, following in Gandhi's footsteps. She has the unique distinction of being the first woman in India to run for political office three years later. Kamaladevi was up against. The importance of Kamaladevi in the birth of modernday Faridabad is a fascinating fact that many people are unaware of. She took on the task of resettling approximately 50,000 Pathans from the North West Frontier Province (NWFP) in the aftermath of the post-Partition migrations as the founder of the Indian Cooperative Union (ICU). She founded the Indian National Theatre (INT) in 1944, which is now known as the National School of Drama, in addition to her contributions in handicrafts. It was a movement to support the freedom struggle by recognising and celebrating indigenous types of performance like as dance, folklore, and mushairas. Kamaladevi was a key figure in India's political reforms and independence war. She joined Indian National Congress in 1927 and was elected to the All-India Congress Committee within a year. During the Salt March to Dandi, she convinced Gandhi to give women equal opportunity to be in the forefront of the March. Later, she joined Seva Dal and trained women activists.


